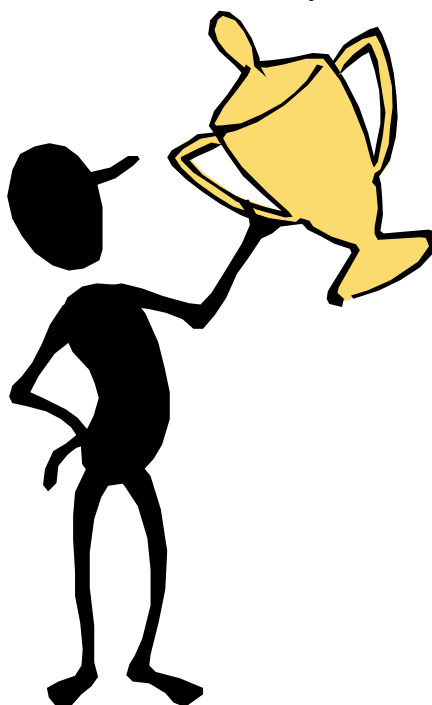

The big 2YO had to be ridden reasonably hard and wide for the first 400 metres to get across to sit outside the leader before taking the lead into the straight and holding on to score from the John Hawkes trained Arrested while the Redoutes Choice—First World came home well to run third. Dashym improved considerably on his first up run where he ran a respectable third on debut and would be expected to have more improvement in him as jockey Nash Rawiller commented on both occasions regarding his greenness. Dashym has kicked off his career in nice fashion and has picked up Super Vobis money at each of his two runs. His record stands at two starts for one win and one third for prize money to

The excitement for this syndicate has not quite finished as yet this time in as Mick now heads towards preparing Dashym for his next run which is to be expected to be the \$502,000 Inglis Premier to be run at Caulfield over 1200 metres on March 4.
